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Read Acts 1:1-9; 2:1-15; 37-41.

1. Which is the right way and which is the wrong way to focus on the past?

3. What was the greatest change in the disciples following Pentecost? Give some examples.

4. What aspects of our early history do you find most fascinating and inspiring? Why is it important to know our "spiritual" roots?

5. On the wall of All Saints Church, Monkwearmouth, Sunderland is an inscription: "September 1907. When the fire of the Lord fell, it burned up the debt." What might this teach us about spiritual renewal? Has this been your experience too?

6. How would you have reacted if you had been an eye-witness of the miracle of Glyn Thomas? Do we believe that for God all things are possible? Have we become "unbelieving believers?"

7. What do you believe marks out a pentecostal believer? (small 'p'... I am not speaking about denominations here). What did Steve mean when he said that it is possible to be Pentecostal (capital 'p') without being pentecostal (small 'p')?

8. In which way is today's society like the ancient Egyptian society? (see Exod. 1:8). In which ways have we lost sight of the amazing Christian foundations laid by our predecessors?
