Mark chapter 6

Life Group Notes

Some Scriptures used: Mark 6:1-56; Isaiah 61:1-2; Luke 4:16-30; 7:1-10; Matthew 5:10-12; 14:13-36; John 6:5-13; Ephesians 1:18-23.

- 1. Read through the chapter. What questions or revelations do you have?
- 2. Read Mark 6:1-6, Matthew 13:54-58 and Luke 4:16-30. Why did people from Jesus' home town take offense (Gk. *scandalised*) at him? (Mark 6:3). Consider the way that they refer to Jesus. Steve said: 'Jesus often worked where there was no belief, but not where there was unbelief.' What did he mean? What are the lessons for today from these verses?
- 3. What are the reasons Jesus gave his disciples such detailed instructions when he sent them on mission? (see 6-13)
- 4. Who did people think that Jesus was? Who do people in our day claim that Jesus was? What is your response to them?
- 5. How might the story of John's murder at the hands of Herod have spoken to Mark's original recipients? (see v14-29). How do you react when something bad happens? Do you respond with 'Why God?' or 'Why me?' or neither or both?
- 6. In which way did Jesus test his disciples regarding the hungry crowd? (see v35-38; compare John 6:5-9). What was the nature of the test? See v47-48: why do you think Jesus delayed his assistance and help?
- 7. Why do you think that Mark omitted the detail of Peter's walking n water? (see Matthew 14:25-31)
- 8. What point was Mark making through his comment, ". . . for they had not understood about the loaves; their hearts were hardened." (v52). What do 'loaves' and 'walking on water' have in common? What's the connection? Importantly, what is the lesson for us?
