## Life Group Notes

- 1. Read: Mark 10:17- 31. Do you have any troubling questions about this passage? What does it have in common with Luke 10:25-37?
- 2. Why do you think that Jesus answered the initial questions of the rich young ruler and the expert in the law (see also Luke 10:25) in a way that was very different to the Apostle Paul (see Acts 16:30-31)? *Clues*:
  - i. Was it the same question being asked?
  - ii. What does 'eternal life' mean? What were these men actually asking?
  - iii. Why was obedience to the commandments focused on by Jesus?
- Is the standard of entry into the Kingdom about "selling everything and giving to the poor" or was this man a 'special case'? (see also Luke 8:3; 19:1-10 as examples).
- 4. Jesus also spoke of entry into the Kingdom in Matthew 5:20. Why is this verse so startling? What truth was Jesus communicating about his Kingdom through saying this? (see also Matt. 5:20-48)
- 5. Having read the Mark 10:17-31 account, do you ever find yourself asking the question asked in v26? What comforting response did Jesus give? What do you understand Jesus to mean?
- 6. To recap: what were the entrance requirements of the Kingdom for
  - i. the rich young ruler (Mark 10:21)
  - ii. the expert in the law (Luke 10:37)
  - iii. Nicodemus (John 3:3)
  - iv. The women Jesus met at the well (John 4:16-18)

What in the message for us in this? What is the Lord requiring of us to be citizens in his kingdom?
